We are into our second year of Medicaid expansion and most of our patients have learned to use their insurance. We all took advantage of the opportunity for EMR training and are slowly implementing it at the clinic.

I'm excited to report that we've had our first and second sessions of "Cooking Matters."

This program was held through Gleaners and jumpstarted our wellness plan to equip our patients with the information that they need to become healthier by controlling diabetes and hypertension.

We stretched ourselves even further (pun intended) with two successful sessions of gentle, Yoga exercise. During "6 Weeks of Yoga," we monitored each participant's daily steps with a Fitness Pal pedometer. We are continuing to track BMI and blood pressures.

We have also been busy expanding health literacy by educating our patients on different chronic diseases and preventive health issues. Through sharing posters, distributing handouts, and showing videos with preand post-surveys, we've been able to determine and understand the needs of our

patients and identify opportunities for further educational activities.

We continue to take pride in being a site that offers an educational experience to students from the surrounding colleges and universities that are rotating throughout the clinic. After all, they are our future healthcare team.





## Victor Can See Again



Victor (not his real name) is a 34 year old male who cannot get health insurance. He came to Cabrini Clinic in the fall of 2014; he was having trouble seeing. Cabrini Clinic referred Victor to Dr. Bernard Miller for an eye exam; Victor probably needed glasses. Dr. Miller's eye exam revealed that Victor had cataracts, his vision was 20/400 in both eyes, and could not be corrected with surgery. After many months, and an exhaustive search for someone to perform the cataract surgery, Dr. Miller found Dr. Shanbom of Berkley, MI. who agreed to do the surgery for free. Because of Cabrini Clinic and its extensive network of volunteers, community partners, and the generosity of people like Dr. Miller and Dr. Shanbom, Victor can see again. On behalf of Victor and all the patients helped at Cabrini clinic, thank you.

What do you want people to know about our collaboration?

**Cabrini Clinic:** It happened because we kept asking for help; we knew there was someone out there meant to provide "a leg."

Chris from Anew Life: Our collaboration is not unique. Everyone has a part to play. Don't be afraid to network, listen for other's needs and do what you can. Ask yourself, how can I make a difference in someone else's life?
